You are 90% correct. When the chord moves from ii to V, the 7th of ii moves down 1/2 step to become the 3rd of V. So, in the key of C, the "C" resolves downward to the "B". This exercise is about learning to hear how each of the 5 notes sounds in the context of these two chord changes.

"Improvisation #1" (which was freely improvised in the studio) evolves from sound explorations to a riff section and back, while "Improvisation #2" is a lowdown but spacy blues. The longer pieces tend to be episodic and a little reminiscent of Charles Mingus in the way that they reinvent the past a bit to form a new and uncertain future.

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
