Other writings. Other notable writings of Dōgen are: Fukanzazengi (法華指掌疏, General Advice on the Principles of Zazen), one volume; probably written immediately after Dōgen's return from China in 1227. Bendōwa (圓覺經疏, "On the Endeavor of the Way"), written in 1231. This represents one of Dōgen's earliest writings and asserts the superiority of the practice of shikantaza through a series of questions and answers.
