In an academic setting, play can also help children learn and grow. Teacher-initiated play is a close cousin to inquiry based learning. At Whitby, our early child educators ask children questions about the rules and process that govern the play, and then encourage children to make connections to the wider world through their own body of knowledge.

How Do Children Learn Through Play? - Whitby School

Guide students to imagine how they will feel when they learn something new. Allow volunteers to describe their feelings after they learned something. When appropriate, ask students to visualize what a finished project will look like. Encourage students to tell a friend their learning goal and get their support.

Unschooling children, free from the intimidation of public embarrassment and failing marks, retain their openness to new exploration. Children learn by asking questions, not by answering them. Toddlers ask many questions, and so do school children - until about grade three.

Nurturing Children's Natural Love of Learning - The ...

Teach children it's okay to ask questions. Sometimes, children are taught that asking questions is rude and intrusive—when it's actually a great way to learn about differences. Rather than stigmatizing questions, show children how to ask them sensitively and appropriately.

Theories of mind As they mature, children develop theories of what it means to learn and understand that profoundly influence how they situate themselves in settings that demand effortful and intentional learning (Bereiter and Scardamalia, 1989). Children entertain various theories of mind and intelligence (Dweck and Legget, 1988).

A positive learning environment not only consists of the physical setting, but it also encompasses how the child feels or responds to the setting. There are a number of ways families and educators can create an environment for children that is conducive to learning.

How to Create a Positive Learning Environment for Children ...

As children share their receptive and expressive understandings of the social context, they represent what they are learning in a variety of ways (e.g., writing, drawing, painting, dramatic play, 3-dimensional construction, music and movement, and graphics). Inquiry-based learning also provides group learning opportunities that serve a common goal and purpose, which offers children ownership and belonging through a collaborative situation (Mindes, 2005).

Explicitly teach, model and construct generalizations together throughout the inquiry process. Give more time for thinking and synthesizing. During “how we organize ourselves”, we organized the concepts we learned about organizations in the first weeks of inquiry together on the carpet.

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
